Dear Michigan Public Service Commissioners,

I'm writing in regards to case number U-21090, the Consumers Energy Integrated Resource Plan.

While some elements of Consumers Energy's plans are positive, particularly the retirement of coal by 2025, the plan is not sufficiently aggressive to match the scale of the climate crisis and transition to a fully decarbonized grid as soon as possible. Rather than purchase four existing gas plants, Consumers Energy should transition away from fossil fuels altogether and invest heavily in carbon-free energy, energy efficiency, and battery storage. I urge you to require the following modifications as conditions of IRP approval:

- Consumers must not purchase any existing gas plants. Michigan cannot afford to swap one polluting fossil fuel for another.
- Consumers should significantly strengthen it's investments in solar and battery storage and determine more aggressive renewable energy targets. 63% clean energy by 2040 is simply not enough.
- Consumers should commit to including behind-the-meter distributed generation in it's 2024 IRP, allowing electricity to be generated near where it's used.

Consumers Energy can — and must — do better for its consumers, the climate, and Michigan's clean energy transition. Please set a precedent by holding Consumers accountable to the public interest.
