NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF DTE ELECTRIC COMPANY FOR
APPROVAL OF ITS INTEGRATED RESOURCE PLAN PURSUANT TO MCL 460.6T,
AND FOR OTHER RELIEF**

- DTE Electric Company (DTE Electric) requests Michigan Public Service Commission's (MPSC) approval of the following: 1) DTE Electric's Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) as proposed in its November 3, 2022 application; 2) that DTE Electric does not have a material long term need for generation capacity beginning in any of the next five (5) years; 3) DTE Electric's proposed costs for conversion of the Belle River Power Plant, commencing within three years following the Commission's approval of its Integrated Resource Plan; 4) DTE Electric's Financial Compensation Mechanism; and 5) regulatory asset treatment for the remaining net book values of the Monroe Power Plant and the Belle River Power Plant's coal handling assets including cost of removal, decommissioning, and capital expenditures incurred at Monroe after the initial regulatory asset reclassification subject to review in future general rate cases. - The intent of this hearing is to inform the public about DTE Electric's November 3, 2022, application requesting MPSC approval of its Integrated Resource Plan pursuant to MCL 460.6t in [Case No. U-21193](#). The public hearing will be legislative in nature and any person may present data and views during the public comment period.
- The hearing is open to the public and the information below describes how a person may participate in this public hearing. The hearing will be conducted by an Administrative Law Judge as the presiding officer.
- This hearing is being held **remotely by video/teleconference only**.

TIME: 4:00 PM – 7:00 PM
The hearing may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

PARTICIPATION: The hearing is open to the public, and any interested person may participate by using the Microsoft Teams Livestream [hearing link](#), or by dialing (248) 509-0316 and entering the conference ID 550 810 363# when prompted.

A transcript of the public hearing will be filed in the docket for Case No. U-21193. This hearing may also be recorded, and the recording may be posted at www.youtube.com/MichiganPublicServiceCommission.

In the event of a disconnection caused by the meeting host, the public hearing will be deemed in recess. Every effort will be made to reestablish a publicly accessible connection. If the host is unable to do so within a period of 30 minutes from the time of the disconnection, the public hearing will adjourn and will not address any new business. The public hearing will not recess or adjourn due to technical or other issues experienced by individual members of the public that render them unable to attend or participate in the meeting. Admin Code, R 792.10106 and R 792.10401 through R 792.10448.

Public Comment for the Public Hearing:

Members of the public who wish to make a comment may do so during the public comment portion of the hearing, subject to the following requirements. Comments should be limited to no longer than three (3) minutes; however, the presiding officer will manage the public comment process and may adjust or place further limits on how long a person may speak.

Public comments must be directed to the Commission and should not be used to engage with other participants or respond to their comments. The public comment period is an opportunity for commissioners to listen to comments and concerns and not to answer questions. Public comments should be limited to one per person.

The Commission will take public comments in the following order: Microsoft Teams Livestream Q&A, and phone.

Public Comment Requests via Microsoft Teams Livestream Q&A

If you would like to be queued up for verbal comments during the public hearing and have access to the Microsoft Teams Livestream, you may do so by entering your full name and where you live into

Please avoid including any written comments in the Q&A feature. This feature is available on the right-hand side of the control bar next to the mute button.

Public Comments via Phone

After taking up comments from those through the Q&A feature, the presiding officer will then provide an opportunity for comment from individuals who are participating by phone but not utilizing the online Q&A feature, provided time permits. When it is your turn to speak, press *6 on your phone to unmute. Please indicate your name, and where you live if you are willing to share, so we have that information for our records.
