NOTICE OF HEARING FOR THE ELECTRIC DELIVERY AND SUPPLY CUSTOMERS OF THE DETROIT EDISON COMPANY

CASE NO. U-13808

- The Detroit Edison Company (Detroit Edison) may between 2004 and 2006 increase its annual base electric revenues by a total of approximately \$416 million above current frozen rate levels, may use a monthly power supply cost recovery (PSCR) factor of 2.18 mills per kilowatt-hour in 2004 (including the choice mitigation adjustment operating in tandem with the PSCR factor) to compute its customers' 2004 bills, may use a different monthly PSCR factor for 2005 that will be determined at a later date, may receive miscellaneous accounting authority and may obtain recovery of the company's base electric revenues above the level of current frozen rates of up to \$270 million in 2004, an additional \$40 million in 2005 and an additional \$106 million in 2006 (all based on estimated 2004 sales levels). The annual increase in base electric rates may continue in effect beyond 2005, and different PSCR factors may be implemented in the years 2005, 2006 and thereafter. Accounting authority obtained by the company may be implemented in 2004 and continue thereafter. Approval to recover regulatory assets may commence in 2004, with resultant additional increases of \$31 million in 2004, an additional \$13 million in 2005 and an additional \$65 million in 2006, implemented and continuing consistent with the statutory rate caps established by 2000 PA 141, until such regulatory assets are fully recovered over a five year period. Detroit Edison has requested that \$399 million of these increases be approved on an immediate basis, but not later than January 1, 2004, subject to implementation within the rate cap limits and subject to refund after the entire case is concluded.
- NOTWITHSTANDING THE COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR RATE RELIEF, A TYPICAL RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER'S AVERAGE ELECTRIC BILL WILL NOT INCREASE IN 2004 OR 2005 OVER CURRENT FROZEN RATES, BUT MAY BE INCREASED BY \$6.96 PER MONTH IN 2006 AND THEREAFTER.**

The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider Detroit Edison's June 26, 2003 request to increase its annual base electric revenues by a total of approximately \$416 million above current frozen rate levels, to use a PSCR factor of 2.18 mills per kilowatt-hour to compute its customers' 2004 bills (including the choice mitigation adjustment operating in tandem with the PSCR factor), to use a PSCR factor in 2005 that will be determined at a later date, to obtain miscellaneous accounting authority, and to recover regulatory assets. Because of rate cap limits, this proposal will result in a net increase in the company's electric revenues of up to \$270 million in 2004, an additional \$40 million in 2005 and an additional \$106 million in 2006 (all based on estimated 2004 sales levels). The annual increase in base electric rates may continue in effect beyond 2005, and different PSCR factors may be implemented in the years 2005, 2006, and thereafter. Accounting authority obtained by the company may be implemented in 2004 and continue thereafter. Approval to recover regulatory assets may commence in 2004, with resultant additional increases of \$31 million in 2004, an additional \$13 million in 2005, and an additional \$65 million in 2006, implemented and continuing consistent with the statutory rate caps established by 2000 PA 141, until such regulatory assets are fully recovered over a five-year period. Detroit Edison has requested that \$399 million of these increases be approved on an immediate basis, but not later than January 1, 2004, subject to implementation within the rate cap limits and subject to refund after the entire case is concluded.

Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case, may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of their wish to make a statement of position.

THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION MAY GRANT OR DENY THE REQUESTED INCREASES AND OTHER PROPOSALS, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, AND MAY GRANT LESSER OR GREATER INCREASES THAN THOSE REQUESTED, AND MAY AUTHORIZE A LESSER OR GREATER RATE FOR ANY CLASS OF SERVICE THAN THAT REQUESTED.
